

The Great Awakening

I have always been intrigued with the Biblical stories that accompany the first followers of Jesus, especially those stories that immediately follow after the resurrection of our Lord Jesus.

Thomas, our doubting disciple, has always been one of the “real” disciples who it appears to need the extra proof for the resurrection by being able to place his hands upon Jesus, to touch the wounds of the crucifixion. *John 20:19-31*

Mary Magdalene is another follower of Jesus who is surprised by Jesus as he looks like a common ordinary gardener tending the flowers and paths of the cemetery. *John 20:10-18*

The two disciples that take a walk to Emmaus, some seven miles out of Jerusalem have also captured my imagination over the years. “Did not our hearts burn” when referencing their encounter with the strangers on the road, which is the subject of a famous painting that hung in my home church of Peace Lutheran just above the entrance/exit and that now hangs in my home study. *Luke 24:13-33*

There are many “eye-witness” accounts of the resurrected Lord and Savior, compelling testimonies as to the reality of the resurrection victory of Jesus over death and the grave. *Acts 10:34-43, I Corinthians 15:1-11, Luke 24:34*

Equally compelling is the call for the earliest disciples to be a “witness” to these events, to proclaim and live out this new reality of resurrection life in Jesus. *Luke 24:48, Acts 1:8*

As a “witness to Jesus” these early disciples were quick to move on... to “follow” Jesus, to leave behind all that seemed to hold them captive and to enter into the brave new life of living for Jesus.

So I wonder how that is for you and me... today! Have we been captivated by the story of Jesus in such a way that we have left behind all that holds us down, that which binds us to our idols, the pains of the unkind world, the relationship that went south, the hopes that have been changed because of health, job or family needs? Are we living that new and renewed life in Jesus? Or are you sleep walking through your memories of misguided ways.

It’s time to wake up to the new “Awakening”!

The first Great Awakening started in this country in 1740. Jonathan Edwards was the principle architect of that mass transformation... of the “revival” of the Christian movement of faith. A second Great Awakening took place in the mid 1800’s, and yet another in the early 1900’s. In the 1960’s we saw a different awakening of sorts as believers and non-believer argued with the “God is Dead” movement.

In the midst of that very question another “Awakening” began as the church started to redefine itself, calling for a deeper connection to Jesus, an evangelical fervor with an emphasis on a more individual relationship and a church that was willing to celebrate the questions and encourage new forms of worship, of social outreach and service to the community.

We are still in that time of “Awakening” but it appears that it stalled for bit, but now there seems to be a turnaround... a reversal of sorts, a reawakening... “Did not our hearts burn” kind of change where new hope seems to be dawning on the people of faith, where the great religious recession is giving way to an increased confidence in the leading of God’s spirit to a religious faith that is spiritually connected to the disciplines of worship, confession and forgiveness, discernment, fellowship and mission. The Holy Spirit is redefining our vision and mission, much in the same way that the earliest followers of the “Way” experienced the redefinition, the renewal of their lives in Christ Jesus. It is about our practice, “see how they loved”, how they cared for each other, how they touched those in the community.

Our mission is to grow spiritually as disciples of Jesus Christ through worship, fellowship, mission, learning and prayer. Maybe we will call this the “Great Returning”. The return to the wonder and awe of our relationship with our Creator God, to the power and presence of our Savior, to the compassionate gifting of the Holy Spirit and the attending gifts of love, joy, peace patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control.

And what will this mean for Trinity Lutheran Church of Pleasanton? We have not given up, beaten and bruised up a bit to be sure, but ready to move forward with the upward call of Jesus Christ, to the glory of God.

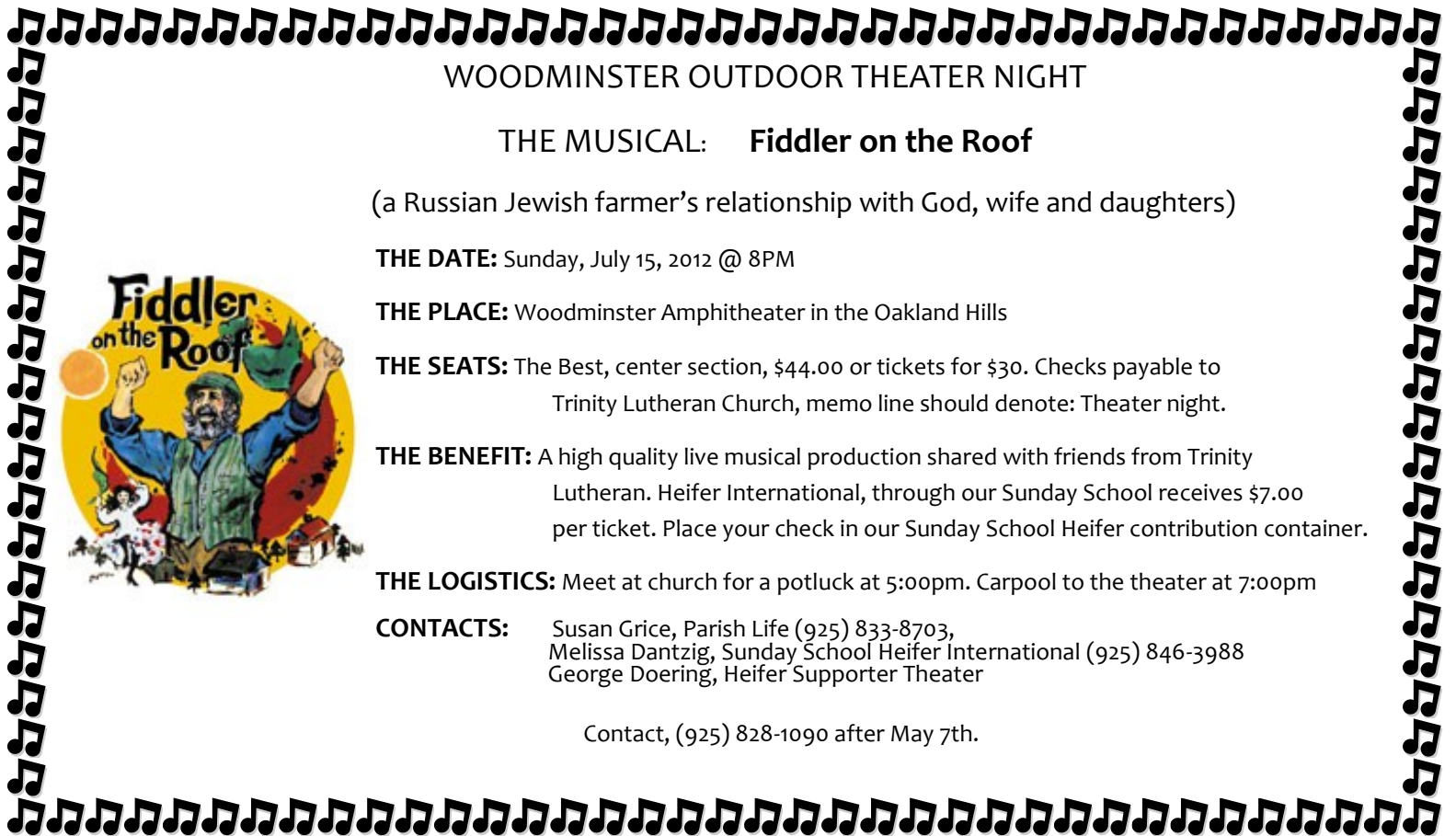

May is Mt. Cross Lutheran Camp Month


On a hill at Mount Cross stands an old Redwood Tree. Over 1,200 years old and 60 feet around, the Big Tree, as it has come to be called, is an emblem of Mount Cross’s ministry with people of all ages. Since 1948 people have come together for spiritual renewal, for learning how to live the Christian life, for strengthening one another, and for mobilizing for service in the church and world.

Early in their lives, young people are captured by God’s love for them in Christ. They find comfort, strength and direction for their lives. Adults become more committed to serving others and to living as disciples of Christ. Leaders are equipped to make congregational ministries effective. Families are strengthened.

Mount Cross is a focal point for ministry, a gathering place from which springs creative and effective people, loving their Lord and equipped to serve in all corners of the world.

Mt. Cross Ministries' main site is located in the coastal redwood forest of the Santa Cruz Mountains, 20 minutes from the Santa Cruz beaches. Mt. Cross offers summer camp and retreat opportunities for all ages. Most Mt. Cross directed camps are on the main site and many, like Day Camps, take place in communities all over northern California.

Churches, schools, clubs and other organizations use Mt. Cross as their group retreat center. Mt. Cross provides facilities, meal service and program support. Many groups take advantage of the Team Initiative Program (ropes course) and/or climbing tower.
